6 one-month fellowships

The Center for Subjectivity Research (CFS) advertises up to 6 one-month fellowships connected to its ongoing *Who are We*? research project. Fellows who are accepted into the program will be offered the opportunity to spend one month at CFS in Copenhagen during the period 1.2.2025 - 30.6.2025.

Fellows will be provided with workspace at CFS and will be able to participate in any CFS events taking place during the fellowship period.

The fellowships which are open to both early career and senior researchers will cover documented travel costs and accommodation for up to 15.000 DKK (approx. \notin 2000) and running costs for 15.000 DKK (approx. \notin 2000), which will be disbursed as a one-time payment at the end of the research stay. (Note: The payment for running costs may count as taxable income in the fellow's country of residence.)

CFS: Since 2002 the Center for Subjectivity Research has carried out research on the self and its relations to others and the world from an interdisciplinary perspective. Its exploration of subjectivity has explicitly sought to further the integration of different philosophical traditions, in particular phenomenology and analytic philosophy of mind. Much time has also been invested in promoting the dialogue between philosophy and empirical science, in particular psychiatry and psychopathology, but also clinical psychology, cognitive science, developmental psychology, anthropology, and sociology.

Who Are We: The *Who are We*? project which is supported by The European Research Council and the Carlsberg Foundation investigates what it means to feel, think, and act as part of a we. Its guiding hypothesis is that a systematic account of the we must be embedded in a more comprehensive investigation of selfhood and social cognition. The project systematically develops this hypothesis by combining cross-disciplinary theorizing with historical scholarship. In particular, it draws on seminal contributions from classical phenomenology. In addition to philosophers, the project also involves social scientists (from social anthropology, sociology, social psychology, and political theory). Applicants interested in applying should get into contact with one of the current members of the *Who are We*? project (<u>https://cfs.ku.dk/research-activities/researchprojects/who-are-we/</u>) who will figure as their mentors or with whom they would collaborate. The application should include a CV (of max 3 pages), a project description (of max 3 pages) outlining the intended purpose of the research visit (and state with which CFS member the applicant would like to work with as well as the preferred period of visit), and one prior publication. Preference will be given to applicants who have engaged with research results from the *Who are we*? project in their prior work.
